## A Doorway to Dignity

t Presbyterian Night Shelter, we learned long ago that the ability to earn a steady income is fundamental to someone's ability to exit homelessness. And so we created UpSpire – to lower barriers to employment so that people can get back on their feet. UpSpire gives individuals a choice, a voice, and a pathway to a sustainable lifestyle through full-time employment with benefits, job coaching, and support.

While UpSpire is changing lives, it has also become an important partner to the City of Fort Worth, which recently brought on five new Litter Abatement teams, creating twenty-five brand new jobs.

"You get your dignity back," says Tommy Sanford, a Journeyman Carpenter at WOODWORKS by UpSpire. Tommy first came to the Shelter as a guest with no ID, few resources, and dwindling hope. Working with his Journey Home Guide, Tommy took advantage of all the Shelter had to offer, regaining his stability. Initially slated to work in the kitchen, a different job opportunity sent him to WOODWORKS instead. An opportunity that would awaken a new passion within him.

"It's been the best experience," he says, "the best learning experience imaginable. I'd never built furniture before I stepped into this warehouse. I never worked in an environment that means much more than just a paycheck."

UpSpire will continue playing an even more important part in Fort Worth with the launch of our newest social

enterprise in 2026: Greater Good Collective. This UpSpire expansion will include a donation station, a curated thrift store, and coffee shop, adding vital jobs for women and mothers in Fort Worth's Las Vegas Trail district.

Today, Tommy is not only thriving in his vocation, he is also mentoring other individuals as they travel a similar path on their journey home. "Everybody's got a light," he says, smiling, "It's just, you know, helping them turn that switch on."


