ELCOME TO MY HOME!" LEE ANN SAYS AS SHE ENTHUSIASTICALLY OPENS THE DOOR TO HER NEW APARTMENT. After experiencing homelessness for the last couple of years, she is now a resident at our newest Journey Home Housing community, thrilled to be out of an emergency shelter setting and into a place of her own.

This month, Presbyterian Night Shelter celebrated the grand opening of intentionally affordable housing at Journey Home Housing communities on Crowley Road and Camp Bowie West, adding 144 new units of housing. The Camp Bowie West development was made possible in partnership with New Leaf Community

Services. For people like Lee Ann, the new community has been a godsend.

Journey Home Housing at Crowley Road consists of 96 newly constructed one-bedroom units situated in quadplexes. Journey Home Housing at Camp Bowie West has 48 units with the same configuration. All homes are furnished with basic appliances, as well as furniture suites handcrafted by WOODWORKS by UpSpire, a social enterprise of Presbyterian Night Shelter. Linens, cleaning supply starter kits, plus other household essentials were supplied through donations to the Shelter's "Warm the House" campaign.

"They're excited to see the property, but there is also that fear to move into a unit that they presume to be empty," states Tyra Sanders, Director of Site-Based Housing, about bringing a resident to their new home for

the first time. "We walk them to their direct unit. And they see that we have dishes and soap, and we have curtains, a TV, bed, and pillows - all these things. You know, it really triggers another type of iov!"

Residents like Lee Ann feel a certain relief once they are placed in their new home, appreciative of the opportunity and keenly aware of the littlest things most of us take for granted, like finally having a quiet space to call their own.

"I can't even express all the words I want to say," she says, "because you just — you feel the love. And I'm just — I'm grateful for it."


